ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH AND SAFETY SPACE HEATER SAFETY.



Required safety features and specifications.

- 1. Contain a tip over shut-off feature and overheat thermal cutoff.
- 2. Built in thermostat that automatically shut down unit when desired temperature is achieved.
- 3. Underwriters Listed or Factory Mutual approved for their intended use.

Safe usage and placement.

- 1. Plug directly into wall outlet without using extension cords or power strips which pose an overheating and fire risk.
- 2. Locate visibly, away from exits and at least 3 feet away from combustible materials eg file cabinets, curtains, desks and paper cans.
- 3. Monitor heater when in operation.
- 4. Space heaters of any type are prohibited in the laboratories and in the presence of children.
- 5. Placing items on top of space heater is prohibited.

Maintenance.

- 1. A professional must immediately repair missing guards, broken controls frayed/damaged cords etc.
- 2. Turn off heater when heated area is not occupied.
- 3. Keep heater away from wet or damp conditions.

Kerosene Heater Safety.

- 1. Use only the fuel recommended by the manufacturer
- 2. Allow heater to cool completely before refueling; wipe up any fuel spills immediately.
- 3. Refuel outside or in a well-ventilated area.
- 4. If using an unvented heater, keep the doors to the rest of the house open to avoid pollutant buildup.
- 5. Keep the wick clean and properly adjusted.
- 6. Never fill the fuel tank above the fill line.

Electric Heater Safety.

- 1. Keep the heater's cord away from areas where it may be tripped over or walked on.
- 2. Make sure the plug fits properly in the outlet; a loose plug can overheat.

Wood Burning Heater Safety

- 1. Heater must meet EPA emission standards.
- 2. Check chimney and stovepipes frequently for buildup; have them cleaned annually.
- 3. Place the heater on a floor protector or fire resistant floor.
- 4. Start fire with paper, kindling, never with flammable liquid like lighter fluid, kerosene or gasoline, and only burn dry seasoned wood.
- 5. Use a metal container for removing ash. Gas heater safety
 - 1. Replace heaters without an oxygen depletion sensor (ODS).
 - 2. If pilot light of heater goes out allow 5 minutes before trying to light the heater again.
 - 3. Do not attempt to light if you smell gas in unit.
 - 4. Light match before turning the gas on.
