Heritage Programming Grant (HPG)

For approval, a proposal must meet <u>all</u> criteria in the Mission Alignment Categories, <u>and</u> score 6 out of the 8 available points, <u>including</u> at least 1 point in each of the four Project Alignment Categories.

Mission Alignment Categories

All programs <u>must</u> meet all of the following criteria for approval:

- *Outcomes:* Outlines clear outcomes and objectives that are in alignment with HPC'S mission to foster meaningful engagement with and deepen our collective appreciation for the campus community's cultural wealth
- Impact Assessment: Outlines method for measuring and assessing the project's progress towards its objectives
- Accessible Reach: Provides specific strategies for accessible engagement with all members of Reed community
